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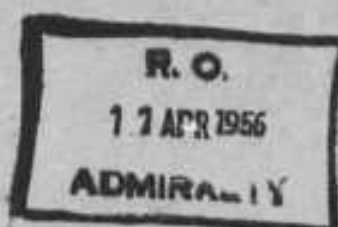

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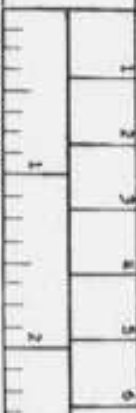

Her Majesty's ship "Lily" was wrecked off
Amour Point, Foul Bay, Coast of Labrador,
on the 16th September, 1889, and seven of her
crew were drowned. After her loss had
capsized, and although it was known that two of
the crew had been drowned near the same spot in
attempting to effect communication with the shore,
JOHN BARRER, A.B., volunteered to swim with a
line through the surf, which he successfully
accomplished, enabling a 4-inch hawser to be
hauled ashore, whereby communication was
established and the rest of the crew saved.

The service was one of great risk and gallantry,
the bottom being rocky, and there being at the
time a dense fog with an ebb tide and considerable
swell.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the "Albert Medal of the First Class" on—

FARABANI, Seaside Tindal, serving in Her Majesty's ship "Wild Swan."

The following is an account of the services in

respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 8th August last, while the "Wild Swan" was off the coast of Mozambique, a fugitive slave boy, named Farejallah, having jumped overboard from a stage alongside the ship, was immediately seized by an enormous shark, which bit off his leg at the knee, dragging him under the water. When he rose to the surface, the shark again attacked him, tearing off his remaining leg and part of the thigh. On Farejallah beginning to rise to the surface again, closely followed by the shark, FARABANI jumped from the netting into the water, and brought the unfortunate boy to the surface, nor did he leave the water till he had placed him in a position of safety.

The Captain of the "Wild Swan" adds, that what makes this, if possible, a more gallant deed, is the fact that FARABANI saw the whole of the horrible catastrophe from the first seizure of the boy, and that, when he jumped into the water, not only the attacking shark, but three others were seen close to the ship, attracted no doubt by the blood.

HER Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the "Albert Medal of the Second Class" on—

FREDERICK JAGGERS, Boatman, of South Shields Coast Guard Station.

The following is an account of the gallant services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

The Norwegian schooner "Atlantic" was wrecked off the South Pier, at South Shields, on the 14th October, 1881, communication with the stranded vessel was speedily effected by means of the rocket apparatus, but as one of the crew was being hauled ashore, the whip—whipline used for hauling to and from a stranded vessel—soured the rocks. FREDERICK JAGGERS, Coast Guard Boatman, at the risk of his life, went into the surf with the view of clearing the line, but was washed off his feet by a heavy sea, and thrown against the rocks which his head struck with such force as to render him insensible. He was then hauled out of the sea.

For this praiseworthy attempt the Board of Trade awarded F. JAGGERS their Bronze Medal for gallantry in attempting to save life at sea.

On the 26th November last (about six weeks after the wreck of the "Atlantic") the "Ida," of Ipswich, ran ashore near the Pier, at South Shields. Between the "Ida" and the rocket apparatus was the wreck of a brig which made communication by rocket difficult. JAGGERS volunteered to be hauled off to the brig, although cautioned of the danger attending such an enterprise, as it was feared her masts would fall, but he reached the brig safely, and from her fore-rigging succeeded in throwing a line on board the "Ida" by means of which the crew were saved.

Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Gray to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of yesterday's date with reference to the principles governing this department in the granting of the Albert Medal.

In reply I am to state that we preserve a very high standard by very seldom giving the First class and only giving the second in cases where the risk to life was not only great but exceeded the chance of safety.

When help might be reasonably expected, or when the risk however great to life was not incurred until the enterprise had already been undertaken, we should not give it.

The First class is only given when life is risked more than once, or when the risk was so overpoweringly great that little short of a miracle could save the man.

This is the sort of ideal which we set ourselves, and which if adhered to proximately keeps up a very high standard.

HER Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on—

RICHARD WRIGHT TOMAN, Engineer of Her Majesty's ship "Foam."

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

On the 2nd August, 1898, whilst Her Majesty's ship "Foam" was carrying out her full speed trial at Malta, the main pressure cylinder burst; the revolutions of the engines at the time being 350 per minute.

There was no indication whatever of the impending explosion, which, of course, happened with great suddenness.

Mr. TOMAN at once ordered every one to leave the engine room, and ran to the main throttle-valve, which is at the fore end of the engine room, and endeavoured to shut it off, getting both arms and hands badly scalded in consequence. He then proceeded to shut off the main stop-valve of boilers in the stokehold.

Having done this with great promptitude, and so confining the steam to the boilers alone, he increased the chance of saving the life of anyone who might have been left below.

Mr. TOMAN, thinking all the men were not up from the engine room, went down and searched in this volume of steam, which was at a pressure of 200 lbs. to the square inch when the cylinder burst, but was unable to find anyone.

He then tried to get on deck, but, owing to the excessive volume of steam, he twice fell halfway down the ladder. He eventually reached the deck, and at once proceeded to turn on the fire extinguishers to the boilers, his hands at the time being almost bare of skin.

The valve wheel was heated to such an extent as to be almost unbearable to hands in an ordinary condition.

As the engines were flying round immediately after the accident there was every danger of the connecting rod being driven through the bottom, but it was greatly lessened by the promptitude and pluck shown by Mr. TOMAN in shutting off the main stop-valve, and so reducing the risk of the ship being sunk or seriously damaged, and the lives of all on board being probably lost.

Mr. TOMAN, after having been driven out of the engine room and severely scalded, again went below into the engine room, which was filled with steam, to search for anyone who may not have been able to escape, and only succeeded in finally getting out of the engine room after two attempts.

Mr. TOMAN was very much scalded on both arms and knees by the escape of steam, which necessitated his removal to hospital.

HIS Majesty has been pleased to confer upon—
Lieutenant HALTON STIRLING LACKY, R.N.,
the Albert Medal of the Second Class, on
the recommendation of the Lords Com-
missioners of the Admiralty, in recognition
of his gallantry in saving life at sea in the
following circumstances:—

On the 25th August, 1900, His Majesty's ship "Widgeon," anchored in Kosi Bay, fifty miles south of Delagoa Bay, in order to land stores and troops. The work of disembarkation was carried out by surf boats manned by Malays under the superintendence of Sub-Lieutenant LACKY, who had been sent on shore for the purpose.

Heavy breakers in lines of three to five, according to the tide, rolling in about fifty yards apart, made the work very risky.

One boat loaded with stores and with Second Lieutenant Arnold Gray, Thorneycroft's Mounted Infantry, Trooper Frederick Trethowen, Steinacker's Horse, and Private J. H. Forbes, Thorneycroft's Mounted Infantry, on board, capsized about three hundred yards from the shore. The five Malays forming the boat's crew, and Private Forbes, by dint of hard swimming, with the assistance of the boat's crew, managed to reach the land after severe buffeting from the heavy seas. Lieutenant Gray was unable to swim, but, with Trooper Trethowen, clung to the boat, which drifted slowly keel upwards in a northerly direction almost parallel with the shore, carried by the set of a strong current. Huge breakers continually swept over the boat, and the men had great difficulty in retaining their hold. Sharks were observed near the boat both before and after the accident. The boat was now about one hundred and fifty yards from the shore. Sub-Lieutenant LACKY, seeing the critical position the two men were in, tore off his clothes and, plunging into the surf, endeavoured to swim to their assistance. He was twice thrown back on the beach by the heavy seas, but afterwards succeeded in bringing first Lieutenant Gray and then the other safe to the shore. The rescued men were quite unconscious, having been nearly thirty minutes in the water. Sub-Lieutenant LACKY and his servant, Private Botting, Royal Marine Light Infantry, then applied the usual methods for restoring animation, and both men eventually recovered consciousness—Lieutenant Gray after a lapse of two and a half hours.

HIS MAJESTY the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on Frederick Paffett, Chief Stoker, R.N., dated the 17th January, 1902.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the evening of June 10th, 1901, at about 9.30, His Majesty's ship "Daring," torpedo boat destroyer, was entering Portsmouth Harbour under easy steam, when an explosion suddenly took place in the after stokehold. A tube was blown out of the lower barrel of No. 2 boiler and the whole stokehold was filled with steam.

At the time of the accident there were five men in the stokehold—Chief Stoker Paffett, and four stokers. Owing to the volume of steam it was impossible for them to see each other, but two men, though scalded and partly overcome by the great heat, managed to get up the ladder to the deck. Paffett, whose place of duty as Chief Stoker gave him the best opportunities of escape, was standing, when the accident occurred, with his hand on the port side ladder. He remained, however, in the stokehold and endeavoured to avert the consequences of the explosion

in the only way possible, namely, by opening the steam valve of the starboard fan. With this object he went deliberately across the hold, groping for the valve which he could not see, the steam from the boiler striking full on his left arm which was shielding his face. But he found it impossible to reach the valve and it was only with difficulty that he was able to regain the ladder, badly scalded and almost unconscious. As he mounted the ladder he was able to save the life of Stoker Elliott, who was slipping down from above in a fainting condition. Paffett being a very powerful man, raised him on his left shoulder and lifted him to the deck; then, reaching the deck himself, aided by those above, he fell down completely overcome. He was much disfigured by burns and scalds; and has almost lost the use of his left arm.

HIS MAJESTY the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on James Sutherland, Leading Stoker, R.N., dated the 1st June, 1902.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred :—

On the night of December the 2nd, 1901, His Majesty's torpedo boat destroyer "Salmon" was entering the port of Harwich in company with the Chatham Instructional Flotilla, when a collision took place between her and the steamship "Cambridge."

It appeared that the "Salmon" was sinking from the injuries she had sustained, and the order was given for the men to go forward and leave the ship by means of ropes which had been passed over the bows of the "Cambridge."

He went on deck immediately but remained behind when the order was given, and went to the stokehold to open the hatches.

He opened one and was in the act of opening the other, when it blew open in his face and a stoker named Scholfield was seen coming up.

Sutherland assisted him out. Scholfield tried to go back for Bartlett, a stoker who was afterwards discovered to have been killed by the steam which the shock of the collision had caused to escape in great quantities from the pipes. He was prevented, however, by Sutherland, who sent him on board the "Cambridge" and said he would look after Bartlett.

Sutherland then by the aid of a light lowered from the "Cambridge" went down into the stokehold.

When he got down there was much steam, although the full force of it had gone. The chief danger, however, was from drowning, as it was full of water, and the ship was in great danger of sinking.

Sutherland found a Chief Stoker named Church in the far end of the stokehold, got behind him and floated him along. A rope was passed down the hatchway, and Church, who was nearly unconscious, was got out.

Sutherland, after looking round to see if anyone else was there, went on deck, searched the forward mess deck and stokers' mess deck, and then went on board the "Cambridge."

ALFRED STICKLEY, Chief Stoker, R.N.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the morning of the 11th June, 1904, at about 11.30, His Majesty's Torpedo Boat Destroyer "Success" was steaming towards Lambeth, when it became apparent from deck, owing to the issue of steam from the funnel, that something was wrong in the after stokehold. Alfred Stickley, Chief Stoker, in accordance with the orders of the Engineer Officer, went below to ascertain the cause.

On reaching the stokehold he found that there was an escape of steam from the top drum of No. 4 Boiler, which shortly caused one of the furnace doors which had been left unclatched to be blown open. The stokehold was immediately filled with flame and steam, and the men present were burnt and scalded.

Stickley grasped the situation with promptness, showing the greatest presence of mind in the emergency, and ran great risks in endeavouring to minimise the consequences of the accident and prevent further injuries to the men.

In spite of the conditions in the stockhold, and his own severe exposure to the flames, he managed to open out the fans to their full extent, and made many gallant attempts to close the furnace door and open the drencher valve. Finding it was impossible to drive the flames back, he gave orders for the hatch to be opened, and himself remained below until the four men in the stockhold effected their escape. His face and neck were severely burned, and his hands and forearms very badly scalded. For over four months he has been on the sick list suffering from his injuries. His lungs escaped injury, as he had the presence of mind to put cotton waste into his mouth while he was in the stockhold.

Howat's perilous position was observed by Ramsay, who at once jumped down to his assistance. The approaching train was only about sixty feet distant at the time, but he succeeded, though at the imminent risk of his own life, in dragging the fallen man back to the platform as the train passed the spot.

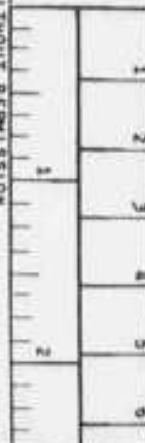

"Melpomene," with a crew of six men, was driven by the blizzard on to the mud about $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile up the river above the Parkstone Jetty, Harwich. Lieut. Startin, on hearing that the whaler was missing, set out alone to search along the river bed. After wading through deep mud, at times up to his armpits, for a distance of about 300 yards, he eventually found the whaler, half full of water, aground on the mud, with her crew lying helpless in the boat, having given up all hope of being rescued. He only succeeded in rousing them by beating them with his stick, one man having to be forcibly dragged all the way to the shore by Lieut. Startin and the coxswain of the boat. After dragging him for about an hour, a distance of about 40 or 50 yards had been covered, when a light was seen moving inshore. Lieut. Startin ordered the crew to remain where they were whilst he went to the light, which proved to be carried by a search party with a rope. This rope was taken backwards and forwards personally by Lieut. Startin from the shore to the boat's crew until each one had been rescued, this exhausting and dangerous task in the deep mud being performed under the most trying weather conditions. All the crew were thus saved, though one afterwards died from the effects of exposure. Medal was presented by The King at Buckingham Palace on the 20th May 1916. Gazette 9th May 1916.

"Warrior" to H.M.S. "Engadine" on the morning of the 1st of June, 1916, succeeding the naval battle off the coast of Jutland, one of the severely wounded, owing to the violent motion of the two ships, was accidentally dropped overboard from a stretcher and fell between the ships. As the ships were working most dangerously, the Commanding Officer of the "Warrior" had to forbid two of his officers from jumping overboard to the rescue of the wounded man, as he considered that it would mean their almost certain death. Before he could be observed, however, Lieutenant Rutland, of H.M.S. "Engadine," went overboard from the forepart of that ship with a bowline, and worked himself aft. He succeeded in putting the bowline around the wounded man and in getting him hauled on board, but it was then found that the man was dead, having been crushed between the two ships. Lieutenant Rutland's escape from a similar fate was miraculous. His bravery is reported to have been magnificent. Gazette 11 August 1916.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:— On the night of Thursday, the 18th January, 1917, a member of the crew of one of His Majesty's Ships, when returning from leave, fell into the sea between the ship and the quay. The matter was at once reported to Acting Lieutenant Frederick William Weeks, R.N.R., to whom it was obvious that any attempt at rescue must be attended by considerable danger. The ship, which was kept clear of the side of the quay by spar leaders of only nine inches in diameter, was working to and fro with the slight swell entering the harbour. Moreover the man was incapable of helping himself; he was of heavy build and was wearing a uniform greatcoat. In view of the risk to the rescuer of being crushed between the ship and the quay, Lieutenant Weeks decided that he could not order a man down. He thereupon took a line and went down himself. By this time the man was almost unconscious. Lieutenant Weeks managed to obtain a hold of his hair and by this means kept him sufficiently above water, whilst wedging himself with his back against the quay with his knees against the ship's side. During this time he was mostly under water, the temperature of which was thirty-nine degrees. He succeeded in securing a line round the man, who was hauled on deck. Hearing the sound of moans coming from inside the engine room, they both attempted to enter it by the foremost hatch and ladder. As the heat in the engine room was intense and volumes of steam were coming up forward, they then lifted one of the square ventilating hatches further aft on the top of the engine room casing (port side) and climbed into the rapidly flooding compartment over the steam pipes, which were extremely hot. Scrambling over the debris, they discovered a man over on the starboard side Stoker Petty Officer Smith, with his head just out of the water. THE GODENROUGH MEDAL AND FUND.
The Godenrough Fund, founded in memory of the late Captain James G. Godenrough, C.B., C.M.G., who died on 19th August, 1876, whilst serving as Commodore on the *Albatross* Station, from which vessel with gallant courage he distinguished himself by saving the lives of a crew of about 100. THE GILBERT BLANE MEDAL.

In 1806 the late Sir Gilbert Blane, Bart., formerly a member of the Board for civil and medical services, established, with the sanction of the Board of Admiralty, a fund for the encouragement of Naval Medical Science, which is vested in the Corporation of the Royal College of Surgeons in London, in trust. This fund is managed for the purpose of conferring a gold medal annually on the Medical Officer who achieves the highest aggregate marks at the examination for promotion to the rank of Surgeon, the award being subject to the approval of the President of the College of Physicians and University Surgeons and the Director-General of the Medical Department of the Navy.

It is any year no Medical Officer causes a valid certificate of examination to be sent to the Board of Admiralty, the medal is held over until the following year, but not more than two medals may be awarded in any one year.

If the awarded Medal is sent to the Director-General of the Medical Department of the Navy, its value is given to the Hospital Fund for the children of Medical Officers.

THE GILBERT BLANE MEDAL.

In 1806 the late Sir Gilbert Blane, Bart., formerly a member of the Board for civil and medical services, established, with the sanction of the Board of Admiralty, a fund for the encouragement of Naval Medical Science, which is vested in the Corporation of the Royal College of Surgeons in London, in trust, for the purpose of conferring a gold medal once in every two years on each of the two Medical Officers (Civil or Naval Surgeon or Surgeon) who shall produce the most approved journal of their practice "in the form" in which they have been kept since due to the fact that in Medical changes of a kind of war in the Royal Navy.

The Presidents of the College of Physicians and of Surgeons, and the Medical Director-General of the Navy award the medal annually for the two best journals sent into office during the preceding period of two years.
